

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#### 13. FEVERS (Enteric, Malarial

Measles, Influenza, Hectic and others)

# 1. Enteric Fever

- Baptisia is the icing of all remedies for typhoid. No remedy can supplant it in the first stage.
   Dr. Burt
- Whatever other remedies are used, *Arsenic* should be given all through the courses of the disease unless the attack is a very mild one.

- Clinical evidence of the pre-eminent value of *Bryonia* at this period (first week) is over whelming. - Dr. Goodnough
- Upon principles of similarity Arsenium alb, ought to be useful in Typhoid fever. It is indeed so. Push Arsenium alb. freely and persistently. I have cured apparent desperate cases with it.
- Caution: In enteric fever, when the temperature comes down to normal and even subnormal, without any serious condition, do not give a remedy, since that will cause a relapse.

- Baptisia is said to be a specific for Typhoid: but the statement is not true. It will abort the case at the beginning if indicated, but is not a specific by any means. Often Arsenic is useful at the beginning. Don't let anyone make you believe that Arsenic is never indicated in the beginning of this disesse. In Typhoid, Arnica and Baptisia are indicated once in a while. Arsenic fairly often, Rhus tox and Bryonia frequently. These 5 remedies probably cover over 80% of the cases.
- I consider *Baptisia* more useful in Typhoid of unusually rapid onset.

- B. Coli infections: The use of B. Coli in Coli infections or in cases of typhoid with loose stools and tympanites and pain in the abdomen: in these cases, sometimes temperature tends to be very obtuse and does not come down properly. Of course in these cases, B. Coli in 200<sup>th</sup> or 30<sup>th</sup> potencies can be tried as an Isopathic remedy, but the best remedy I find indicated in such cases is Methylene Blye in 6<sup>th</sup> potency.

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- Relied upon Arsenicum alb almost exclusively in the treatment of typhoid at hospitals.

- Absinthium has brought more or less sleep in typhoid fever, when in that serious disease, wakefulness has been a prominent and menacing symptom.

- I have seen cases of severe and desperate haemorrhage in typhoid to respond to Variolinum when other remedies failed.

- I can substantiate from experience, the high commendation given to *Baptisia* by Dr. Mitchell of Chicago, as a reducer of the hectic fever of Phthisis.

- Zopfy recommends Kalium hydriodicum and Cannabis sativa in tuberculosis; his 60 years experience verified their use. He used the lx of each in alternation and asserts that no remedy in the entire materia medica has such an influence in lessening the cough, the expectoration, the colliquative sweats and the hectic fever. - Dr. Dewey
- *Carbo veg:* Often at the **brink of death, a saviour** in those states of collapse, dissolution of blood and paralytic conditions, which seem rapidly to involve the whole organism.

- Arsenic: Frequent, copious diarrhoea, which may become involuntary, enlargement, sensitiveness and gurgling of the abdomen, excessive prostration, thirst, nearly imperceptible, intermittent pulse. This remedy is of priceless value and its administration should be preserved with, even in the most disheartening cases. - Dr. Ruddock
- Dr. Ridd who had great success in an epidemic of relapsing fever in Ireland relied chiefly on *Bryonia*. - Dr. Ruddock
- As soon as enteric fever is suspected, Baptisia should be administered, 1 or 2 drops of 1 x dilution or of the strong tincture, every 2 or 3 hours. This remedy is of great value, in modifying and even cutting short the attack by destroying the poison in the blood.

Should however, the administration of *Baptisia* has been much **delayed** and the specific poisonous effects produced, other remedies **must be resorted to**, especially *Arsenicum and Rhus tox.* - **Dr. Ruddock** 

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- Caution: Unless indicated by an exciting cause, Aconite is nearly always injurious in first stage of typhoid fever.

- In lingering remittent fevers of children, having symptoms of helminthiasis, with or without worms, *Cina* is specific.

- Fevers of Septic origin: I have found Pyrogenium invaluable in fevers of Septic origin, all forms: when Baptisia, Echinacia, Rhus tox or the best selected remedy fails to relieve or permanently improve, study Pyrogenium.

- Beptisia : We have repeatedly proved its value in fevers apparently simple, but which failed to yield to Aconite *Baptisia* should be given in a low dilution-the lx or even the strong tincture. - Dr. Ruddock

# 2. Malaria

Against the ravages of malaria, both prophylactic and curative, we will require the study and use of a larger group of remedies. Yet a **sufficiently narrow group**, the most often indicated will enable the prescriber readily to cure **95% of his cases**. Starting with *Natrium mur. Arsenicum album* second and *China Sulph.* third. These remedies properly given in a highly malarial district will afford certain **protection** against the disease. And if the disease be present in an individual, these same three remedies need to be studied and compared for the selection of the **curative agent**.

# 3. Measles

- I give Aconite alone in measles and also to cure the sequelae, if they arise, as they often do, when the disease has been treated with Aconite Dr. Von Grauvogl
- Bryonia is an excellent remedy for measles. It should be given in 2x dilution. It aborts the disease and definitely cuts short its course. It prevents lung affection, which is a common complication.

- Pulsatilla : As an orthodox practitioner, you can not go far wrong if you give the patient a few powders of this remedy.

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> for there is no other treatment for measles apart from nursing and common sense, but if you give *Pulsatilla*, which is often indicated, and it happens to be the **right remedy**, as it usually is, in 9 out of 10, you are **unlikely** to be troubled with any of its very troublesome complications. - Dr. R. - Kalium bichromicum may be given when the respiratory symptoms are complicated with acute Bronchitis or broncho- Pneumonia. This remedy is found to be one of the best. - Dr. John C. Wienski
- Arsenicum alb is almost specific; prophylactic and curative; will remove all the sequelae of the disease. - Dr. Dewey

# 4. Scarlatina

 Probably the very best remedy in the materia medica for parotitis accompanying scarlatina is *Rhus Tox*. The next best is *Calcarea Ost*. and next to that *Lycopodium*.

♦ Occasionally the kidneys are, from the outset, the chief organs affected. Dr. Carrol Dunham of New York records several interesting cases in the publications of the Massachussets Homoeopathic Medical Faculty, in which the renal affection was the form of the disease rather than a sequelae. He states that the group of remedies in which we are most likely to find the Simili for a case of this kind comprises, among others, *Terebinthina, Cantharis, Arsenicum, Apis, China, Carbo Veg. and Phosphorus.*

Ever since I had an opportunity of testing the excellence of Hering's advice to give Sulphur if the skin looks red like a boiled lobster, I have employed Sulphur even if this redness was not yet visible in the precursory stage of the disease, following it up sometimes with Calcarea carb. by which means I have succeeded in many cases in imparting to the exanthema benign character so that no other treatment was required to secure an easy termination of the disease without any further dangerous complications.
