

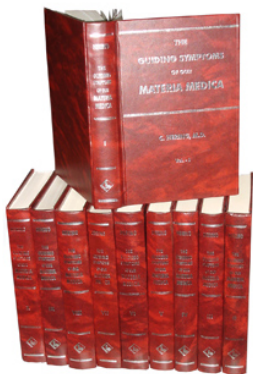

Coniferx.

The *Pinus nigra* or black spruce of this country.

Proved by Dr. Leaman, *Ohio Medical and Surgical Reporter.*

- ¹ **Mind.** Inability to think or study.
I Verj' low-spirited; melancholy.
- ² **Sensorium.** Dizziness; bad feeling in head.
- ³ **Inner Head.** I Headache.
• Terrible distress in head, generally with some flushing of face. Dyspepsia.
- * **Outer Head.** Head hot, with flushed cheeks.
- ¹⁰ **Gums.** : Scurvy.
- ¹³ **Throat.** Choking sensation in throat.
- ¹⁴ **Appetite.** Exceedingly hungry and wakeful at night.
I I Total loss of appetite in morning, craving for food noon and night.
- ¹⁶ **Eating.** iPain after a hearty meal.
I Abstinence from particular food does not >. Dyspepsia.
- ¹⁶ **Belching and Vomiting.** I Belching.
' Acid eructations.
I Frequent vomiting of food.
- ¹⁷ **Scrobiculum and Stomach.** I Severe pain in stomach after eating.

Asclepiadaceas.

The bark of a climbing plant or shrub, found growing in a high altitude in Ecuador, South America, Provings by J. C. Burnett and J. P. Dinsmore.

The tincture is prepared from the dried bark, finely powdered.

Introduced by Hahnemann, who used the white interior of oyster shells and pure flowers of sulphur, from which are prepared the triturations.

LACHNANTHES TINCTOHA.

Red Root.

Hsemodoracex.

AM herb growing in sandy swamps near the coast; the root red, fibrous; the leaves sword-shaped; the stem hairy; flowers yellow, woolly. The first specimen was sent in 1852 by Dr. Byron, from Mouticello, Florida, to Hering, under whose direction it was proved by Raue, Lippe and Fincke. See Am. Horn. Rev., vol. 4, p. 458.

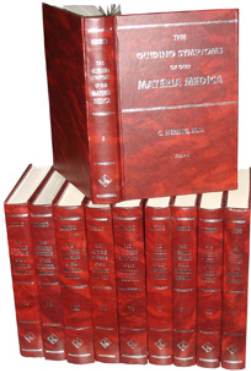
JRanunculacex.
