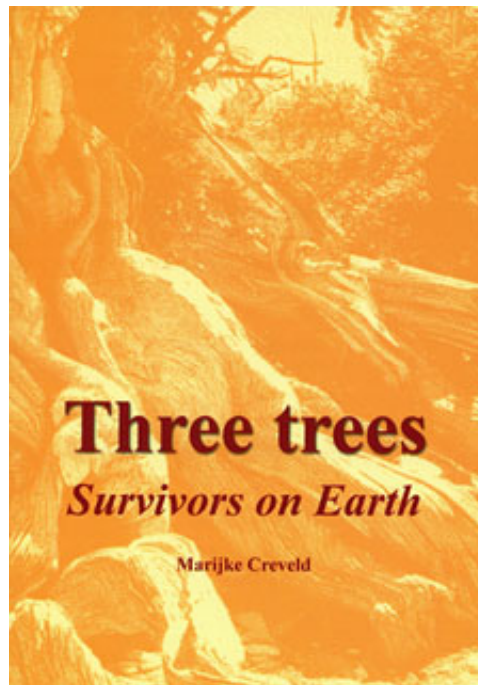

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Summary

Diospyros kaki, the World Tree from Nagasaki

On August 9, 1945 the plutonium bomb was dropped on Nagasaki, heralding the end of World War II. The city was largely wiped out and a major part of its population died. Close to the epicentre a Kaki tree (*Diospyros kaki*) found the strength to survive this inferno. This strength makes it the World Tree. Following the atomic blast, death ruled all around this tree. Those surviving were hit by horrible diseases: extensive scar tissue, internal bleeding, loss of hair, cancer including leukaemia and aberrant children were born.

Diospyros kaki belongs to the Ebenaceae family to which ebony species belong as well. It is indigenous in China and Japan, and has been grown for its edible fruit (sharon or kaki) in southern Europe and Israel. Its properties can be used to cure diseases following radiation and radioactivity. This is shown by Chinese herbal medicine. It stimulates excretions. The positive effect of the fruit on leukaemia has recently been shown, (ref.: Hibasami et al.)

The name of this tree is symbolic: Divine fruit for the soul on earth. Dios = God, Pyros = fruit, ka = soul and ki = energy/ earth. During the proving the following themes were found: survival, insecurity, struggle, danger, rape, death, fire, dilapidated and decrepit houses as symbols of serious disease, illnesses like rectal cancer, itch, and excretion of substances.

Many patients have been treated with *Diospyros kaki* Creveld with good results. Besides complaints caused by radiation, anxiety, anguish and nightmares (related to war and fire) are often found, as is PTSS (Post Traumatic Stress Syndrome). Patients who see me often use expressions like 'survive' and 'unsafe'.

Seventeen persons dreamed using *Radix Diospyros kaki* Creveld and a clairvoyant has examined the remedy. The themes found were similar. The dreams largely deal with 'change and renewal'. *Radix Diospyros kaki* is made from the roots of the same tree. It is triturated using silicon, (ref. Creveld 2008a)

Welwitschia mirabilis, Tweeblaarkanniedood

This tree grows in the Mamib Desert where the San people live and which is believed to be the area of origin of modern man.(ref.: Trouw) This tree is dioecious (female and male flowers grow on separate trees) and belongs to the Gnetophyta, a curious group of trees and plants which shows characters of both Angiosperms and Gymnosperms. The homeopathic remedy was produced from both female and male trees

(seed, seed wings, young male cone and the root of a dead tree) that occurred close to a uranium mine near Swakopmund. During the Welwitschia dreamproving the number of two occurred much; the duality mankind often has to deal with, the choice between good and evil. Often we feel divided, sometimes even split up and we look for a partner in order to feel whole again. This occurs in the dream themes: the female-and-male duality (yin and yang), light and dark, above and below, old and young. Several provers experienced this by day as well and expressed their feelings using words like hate and love, Cain and Abel, Adam and Eve. The theme of prescience and clairvoyance occurs both in dreams and daytime experience.

Welwitschia can help us in the duality transformation process and will be particularly suitable for sensitive persons (HSP), the intuitive, clairvoyant and prescient.

Two people dreamt using Radix Welwitschia mirabilis. Two clairvoyants have examined this remedy, finding the same themes. Light, in particular, frequently occurs in the dreams. Radix Welwitschia mirabilis is made from the same trees. It is triturated using silicon, (ref. Creveld 2008a)

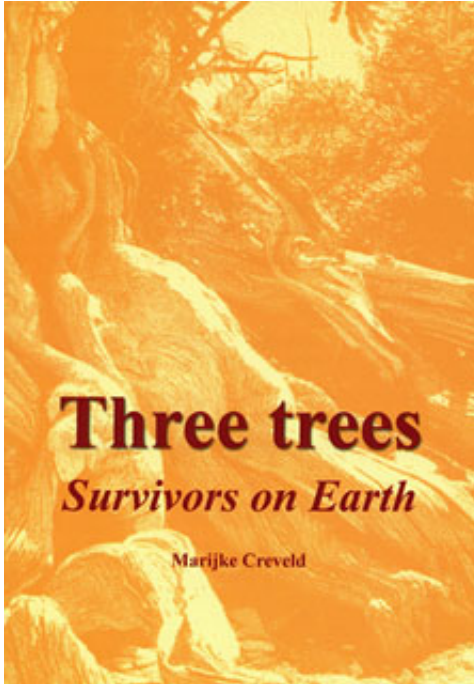
Pinus longaeva, Bristlecone Pine

These are the longest living trees on earth, found high in the White Mountains of California. They were already there when the pyramids of Egypt were built, prior to the existence of classical Greek and Mayan culture. At that time, they were old already. The oldest living specimen, named the Methuselah Tree, is 4,700 years old. Following the retreat of the glaciers of the last Ice Age the seeds quickly germinated - the dead wood lying around here is 10.000 years old and contains the information of centuries past. The living trees have been at the limits of heaven and earth for almost fifty centuries. They are connected to the earth and the cosmos; they communicate with both and are outside time. The homeopathic remedy was made from one of these trees (the root and wood of a branch).

The dreamproving led to many dreams about clear earth and cosmos connexions, whereas the theme of being unconnected, insensitive, no communication also appeared. Some provers, on waking up, felt unconnected whereas another one felt especially connected. The remedy stands for the time and communication themes.

This tree can help us surmount disease caused by loss of contact in our hurried age (discrepancy of internal and external clock) like ME, burnout, withdrawal, loneliness, depression and autism related behaviour.
